Admission Rules

- ▶ Candidates/Parents/Guardians must read all instructions given in the prospectus carefully and submit the online application form complete in all respects to the admission committee.
- ▶ The candidates have to fill up the particulars in the prescribed admission forms.
- ▶ Admission will be strictly on fulfilment of eligibility criteria.
- ▶ Any gap in the academic career of applicant must be supported by an undertaking/affidavit by the candidate.
- ▶ A student must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
- ▶ Rules for admission are subject to change as per UNIVERSITY notification from time to time.
- ▶ Candidates coming from Boards/Universities other than HP Board of School Education, Dharamshala/ H.P.U. Shimla, must produce original migration certificate.
- ▶ A candidate having compartment in 10+2 in any subject is not eligible for seeking admission in B.A./B. Com/B.Sc. 1st year.
- ▶ Admission of a student will be liable to cancellation if he/she furnishes incomplete/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will be taken against such candidates.
- ▶ Girl students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of HP Bonafide certificate for tuition fee-concession.
- ▶ Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.
- ▶ Student seeking exemption from fee and funds for disability must attach an attested copy of at least 40% disability certificate.
- ▶ Students who have been expelled or rusticated from any institution will not be eligible for admission.
- ▶ Student from National Open School will be eligible only if they are passed in all five subjects including English.
- ▶ All admissions are provisional and subject to final approval of UNIVERSITY concerned.
- ▶ A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid by the UNIVERSITY.

Procedure for Online Admission

1. Read the instructions thoroughly as given in the prospectus.
2. Keep soft copies of following documents with you:
 - (a) passport size photograph.
 - (b) Signature specimen.
 - (c) Matric and 10+2 certificates.
 - (d) **For students seeking admission in 2nd and 3rd year classes, last university annual examination admit card.**
 - (e) Character certificate (not more than 6 months older) from the head of the institution last attended (original character certificate to be uploaded with the admission form. For gap cases, character certificate from Panchayat Pradhan / Gazetted Officer along with self-declaration for the gap earlier).
 - (f) SC/ST/PH/Sports/PwD/EWS/WFF/IRDP/BPL/Ward of Ex man/Cultural Certificates (if applicable)
 - (g) Bonafide Certificate for Himachali girls/J&K students.
 - (h) Photocopy of Aadhar Card.
 - (i) Photocopy of bank account number.
 - (j) Migration certificate for students, if passed +2 from other than HPBOSE Dharamshala.
 - (k) If applicable, single girl child affidavit from the competent authority and certificate being a single girl child from the SDM/Tehsildar of the area concerned.
3. Go through the link available on the college website (www.gcchowari.edu.in)
4. Register yourself by paying a fees of ₹50 and then by creating login ID (your working e-mail ID) and password and then proceed to fill in the online admission form.
5. Upload your photograph, signature and the required documents (original scanned and clearly visible documents).
6. Now, submit your online admission form.
7. After submission of admission form by the candidate, it will be checked by the concerned admission committee. In case of any discrepancy, it will be unlocked and sent back to the candidate for necessary corrections and resubmission. A message regarding this shall be sent to the candidate either through SMS or e-mail.

8. If all required information and uploaded documents are found correct; your admission form will be approved by the concerned admission committee.
9. After approval from the concerned admission committee, the link for the payment of admission fee will be opened.
10. Submit your fee online through the given link/payment gateway and the roll number of the candidate will be generated automatically.
11. First year candidate must submit the hard copy/printout of application form along with supporting documents and copy of fee receipt to the respective in-charge.

- One supernumerary seat for “Single girl Child” candidate is reserved in each course provided she fulfils the minimum eligibility criteria.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

Pursuing the aim to enhance and give boost to enrolment in Higher Education, University Grant Commission has proposed Rashtriya Uchtar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). Under this programme, the CBCS has been introduced with a vision to enhance the quality of education. The new UGC CBCS system has been approved and adopted by the Department of Higher Education and H.P.U Shimla beginning session 2018-19 and the admission for the session 2023-24 will also be in accordance with this system.

Bachelor Courses under CBCS

1. B. Sc. Life Sciences: (Botany, Zoology)
2. B. Sc. Physical Sciences: (Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry)
3. B.A. (Pass Course)
4. B.Com. (Pass Course)

Outline of Choice Based Credit System

1. **Core Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course. 4 Discipline Specific Core Courses (DSC) (2 per subject) and 2 Courses of English and Hindi in B.A./B. Com. The papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities with 30% deviation proposed in the draft. The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/university adheres to common minimum standards. Also, the course designed for papers under this category aims to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.
2. Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course** (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific

Elective. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course (2 each for B.A. /B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). “AECC” courses are based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication.

3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

4. Practical/tutorials (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper): The list of practical provided is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to add/subtract/edit practicals from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. Additions will however be of similar nature.

Credit Scheme

1. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core courses each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two courses from the list of Generic Electives courses.
2. An undergraduate degree in science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
3. For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism may be adopted:
 - (a) 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration per week.
 - (b) 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration per week.
 - (c) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two-hour duration per week.

The candidate may choose a combination of two subjects (DSC-1 and DSC-2) from the list of subject combinations. Students are advised to choose subject combinations carefully. There will be no change in the subject combination once the admission is granted to the student in that particular subject combination.

Important Instructions

A candidate shall be required to fulfill the following conditions to appear in the annual examinations: -

- (i.) 75% attendance in theory and practical.
- (ii.) 75% attendance in lectures and seminars.
- (iii.) 100% submission of assignments.
- (iv.) It shall also be mandatory to participate in activities of subject societies.

1. Eligibility for Admission in B.A. 1st/B.Sc. 1st/B.Com. 1st Year

1.1 Age Limit

Maximum age limit for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B. Com. courses is 23 years for male candidates who belong to the general category and 25 years for girls as on 1st July 2023. A relaxation of 3 years is applicable to candidates belonging to SC/ ST category. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of 6 months.

Important

The principal of college will have the right to refuse admission to a candidate during the session on grounds of ragging, indiscipline, misbehaviour or bad conduct including unruly acts and non-observance of code of discipline.

The admission for 2nd and 3rd Year will be as per University/Govt. Notification

1.2 Academic Qualification: A student must pass in the senior secondary (+2) Examination conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education, C.B.S.E. or an examination accepted as equivalent by HP University:-

- (i) provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. 1st Year
- (ii) provided that candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com 1st Year
- (iii) provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Arts, Stream shall be given preference in admission to B.A. 1st Year
- (iv) For students who have not passed 10+2 in Commerce stream and seeking admission in B.Com. 1st, he/she must have studied either Mathematics or Economics at 10+2 level
- (v) The students who want to take Mathematics as Core Course must have studied and passed Mathematics paper at 10+2 level with minimum of 45% marks

The candidates applying for science stream should have passed 10+2 Examination or its equivalent from recognized Board/University with any of the three subjects out of Physics, Chemistry, and Biology or any other science subject with 50% or equivalent grade and if or SC/ST candidate the required eligibility will be 45% or equivalent grade.

Note: Modification in CBCS is subject to change as per Government Notification and University Guidelines, if any amendment is made by in the near future that Government/UNIVERSITY shall be implemented.

2. Eligibility for the Degree

- 2.1 A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a College affiliated to the SPU/H.P. University for a period of not less than three academic year (and not more than five academic years) and passed the examination and fulfilled such conditions as have been prescribed.
- 2.2 The student shall be eligible for degree through **regular mode only**.
- 2.3 For the degree (B.A./B.Sc./B. Com), the student will have to earn minimum of 132 credits hours of course work for over a minimum of three and maximum of five years from the date of admission.

3. Choosing Programme Study Courses

- 3.1 At the time of admission, each student will identify a Core (main) subject in which he/she will concentrate and Core-II (allied) elective subject which he/she would choose to study.
- 3.2 Core subject once identified would not be changed unless the student quits a programme and joins a new programme.
- 3.3 In these subjects, the student will be required to accumulate a certain minimum number of credits in order to qualify for the UG degree.
- 3.4 The degree of the student will be awarded as B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. on the basis of the faculty.

Facilities for Students

- (i) Student can avail leave with prior permission after properly applying for leave on prescribed leave form.
- (ii) A tutor can recommend leave up to 3 days. A student must get application signed by senior tutor for leave up to 7 days.
- (iii) Leave during house examination will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of senior tutor.

Co-Curricular Activities in the College

Eco-Club BASODAN

Environment is indispensable for any living organism and it is a sole responsibility only for human being to save and preserve it for future generation. Therefore, our college has an Eco Club “BASODAN” sanctioned by the State Science and Tech. Dept., H.P. is working in the college to encourage activities like afforestation, sanitation, environment sustainability, conservation, garbage disposal etc. Students participate and create awareness through various activities like poster making awareness campaigns etc.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college has one unit of NCC. The officer commanding 9 HP BN NCC, Dalhousie Cantt. has sanctioned one NCC platoon to the college. NCC cadets will be selected by the Staff of 9 HP BN NCC, Dalhousie Cantt. as per the enrolment rules passed by DG NCC. Total No of sanctioned vacancies are 106 (SD & SW).

Annual Prize Distribution Function

Annual prize distribution function will be held during end of the session. Prizes will be awarded to those students who show excellence in the field of Academic, Sports, Cultural, NSS Rovers and Rangers NCC Red Ribbon Club and other activities on the basis of rules framed for prizes. One memorial trophy Sh. R.R. Awasthi is given to the sports with excellency in academic session.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The national Service Scheme is currently comprising of 100 volunteers. The enrolment is made by Programme Officer on the basis of selection. In every academic session our students participate in number of social programmes organised in the college and outside the college.

Tutorial Groups

Every student is assigned as tutorial group which normally consisted of 40-50 students. Each group is guided by a member of the faculty who is their tutor. The students have to seek advice of their tutor for all problems. They have to get their identity card signed by the concerned tutor/senior tutor. Identity cards must be complete in all respects within 15 days after admission.

Red Ribbon Club

In order to raise awareness level regarding the dreaded HIV/AIDS, blood donation, drug abuse and other related issues, the college has framed Red Ribbon Club.

Rovers & Rangers Units

The Bharat Scouts and Guides is a registered society under Societies Registration Act. It is a voluntary, non-political and secular organization. It is largest youth movement. The college has two units of this organization. The objective of the units is to create in each student the qualities of personal dignity, poise graciousness and social maturity.

SVEEP

Govt of India has started a special programme to enhance the voter awareness and knowledge about election system of our country and register new voter in the voter list, to update address, photo and other credentials. This programme is called Systematic Voter's Education and Electoral Participation and under SVEEP programme our college has also created a SVEEP Club to achieve above mentioned aims.

Disaster Management Cell

Disaster Management Cell is also created in our college to and aware train students about different types of disasters. In every academic session students participate in different awareness, training and mock-drill programmes.

College Magazine

College is a platform for creative buds to recognize their talent and to provide them a forum for the manifestation of their creativity, the College has a magazine "VAGEESHA" named after Goddess Saraswati is brought out annually. The magazine has eight sections. Each section is edited by the member of the staff and is assisted by a student editor. Interesting students can approach the Editorial Staff for any guidance in this regard, so that their original thoughts and creativity can be presented in the right section of college magazine.

Career Guidance & Counselling Cell

After passing a secondary school, a student reaches at the threshold of career development. So, a career Guidance and counselling cell has been established in the college to provide the guidance

and proper counselling to the students regarding their future prospects and career, vitally taking their qualification and interest into account. Information related to job avenues is also displayed on the notice board from time to time. There is separate notice board for admission and job alerts.

Sports Activities

The college provides facilities to those who wish to make a mark in sports. College sends team for various University Championships like Athletics, Chess, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Kabaddi, Basketball and Weight lifting (M/W). No student can play for an outside team without the written permission of the Principal. Annual Athletic Meet of the college is also another opportunity for the students to show their calibre and excellence in Athletics and Sports.

Cultural Activities

As we know that in our country there is a diversity of culture and perpetually needs to be grown and develop. Thus, the institution also provides a platform to students to show their talent through various cultural activities at H.P.U. Youth Festival, Inter College and Intra College Competition. 3. The college provides limited financial support as permitted under rules.
